Scouts are no strangers to adventure, but preparing for the unexpected is a core discipline.

Scouts received Emergency Response and First Aid Life-saving skills that extend far beyond the handbook.

A simulated car crash provided the scenario where Scouts practiced treating strains, sprains, breaks, hypothermia and hyperthermia, in the field with competence, and a calm demeanour. They learnt to assess situations swiftly, act decisively, and provide aid effectively, often in remote or challenging environments.

Central was patient care and transport. Scouts were given techniques for safely moving an injured person across a river to an evacuation point, through teamwork and coordination.
