FRESHWATER GOLD CLAM

The Jamboree team will supply two or three large rubbish bags per small team (Patrols). We intend that other small teams can reuse the rubbish bags when brought back the next day to the water-based activity.

Look out for details on the approved treatment method via the BAND App (for Troop Leaders) and Jamboree online communications channels this week.

A reminder. Troops will need to bring fish bins or large buckets capable of thoroughly soaking any gear used at the water-based activity (WATBOAPADFLY Adventure) by a small team and accompanying adult.
